

**CALL FOR NOMINATIONS:
JOSEPH J. SPENGLER BOOK PRIZE OF THE HISTORY OF ECONOMICS SOCIETY**

Rules and procedures for awarding the prize

1. Eligibility: Original, authored (non-edited) books in the history of economics published, in English originally, during the three calendar years preceding the HES Meeting at which the award is presented may be nominated. Scholarly books and monographs are eligible, but neither textbooks, nor doctoral dissertations, are eligible. The History of Economics Society will meet June 20-23, 2019, Faculty House, Columbia University, NYC.

2. Nomination Process: Up to two nominations can be made per publisher for books published in the period of eligibility. Publishers should send a nominating note to the Secretary of HES <johnsonm@uwosh.edu>. The Secretary will then provide the publisher with the addresses of the members of the judging committee, to whom copies of the nominated book should be sent. The publisher will need to supply four copies. To ensure that the book can be considered, nominations must be received and book copies supplied to the judging committee members no later than December 31.

Individuals may "self-nominate" by sending a nominating note to the HES Secretary by December 31. Similarly, HES members may nominate an eligible book by sending a note to the HES Secretary. Any nominator other than a publishing company must notify the book's publisher of the nomination. An individual nominator also may want to ask the publisher to provide copies of the book. To ensure that the book can be considered, nominations must be received and book copies supplied to the judging committee members no later than December 31. (It also is suggested that the nominator check with the Secretary to insure that the book has not already been nominated.) Books may be re-nominated in successive years while eligible. Any person who wants to nominate a book should begin by sending a brief nominating statement to Marianne Johnson, Secretary, History of Economics Society. Please state the author(s), title of the book, publisher, and date of publication when making a nomination.

3. Selection Process: The Selection Committee consists of three members of HES named by the President of HES in the months following the annual meeting.

4. Diversity: Research benefits tremendously from diversity. The History of Economics Society encourages nominations of books written by women and by researchers from minority groups that are not always equitably represented in awards programs. Efforts at inclusivity can be especially important to new researchers as they build foundations for successful careers.

5. Announcement: The Chair of the Selection Committee shall prepare a statement to be read at the HES Banquet announcing the Spengler Prize winner. The Prize shall be in the amount of \$500.00 US. The winner also shall receive a suitable plaque at the banquet, one ticket for the conference banquet, complimentary conference registration, and reimbursement of expenses incurred to attend the conference to a maximum of \$1,000 U.S. In case of a shared Prize, the money shall be divided equally, and two plaques shall be awarded.
